Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you all had a much needed rest over the Easter holidays. The children were very tired before we broke up but do seem to have come back with renewed energy ready for the term ahead. Although the weather has not been fantastic and we are still awaiting the much needed sun the children have been able to play on the field in their normal shoes - which they have loved. The field has been full of children enjoying being outside together.

Kemsley class produced some lovely Greek salads this week, there was such a gorgeous fresh aroma coming from their classroom yesterday afternoon. Hurstwood class will be cooking soup next week as an end to their topic of The water Cycle and rivers.

Well done to Fir Tree class who led us in the first class worship of the term. They told us about how the disciples were asked to carry out the work Jesus had started and they thought about how they could also help share God's love through being kind and helpful to others. They shared some of the key points in the story of their lives so far: having a new baby sister and getting a puppy were two of them, what lovely stories! The children enjoyed singing and dancing to the song 'We Will Go!' It was like a mini disco in the hall!

The school council met yesterday and discussed the clubs on offer. As a result of this meeting we will be continuing with key stage 2 football on a Friday lunchtime. All children will need shin pads to be able to take part. We will also be extending all clubs until 4.30 as the children felt there was not enough time once they got changed to enjoy their after school activity. They also talked about the Summer Disco and Leaver's Service and all agreed they prefer these events taking place outside on the school field.

As always we have a busy term, with lots of learning and activities to try to squeeze in. This term is particularly challenging as it is the term where children across the school have to sit national assessments. Year 2 and 6 will both be sitting the SATs tests. Although this is now optional for year 2 we will be continuing to measure and assess them using these national tests as this will give us a very clear indicator of where our children are compared to other year 2 children across the country. Year 2 testing will take place on the week commencing 20th May. Our year 6 testing has to take place during the week starting Monday 13th May. This is the week for all schools nationwide. The timetable for year 6 is as follows:

- Monday 13th May spelling, grammar and punctuation test
- Tuesday 14th May Reading test
- Wednesday 15th May Maths Paper A (Arithmetic paper) and Paper B (Reasoning paper)
- Thursday 16th May Maths Paper B (Reasoning paper)

Please ensure your year 6 child arrives promptly to school during this week. There will be a breakfast of fruit, cereal bars and yogurts provided to them prior to the testing, Monday - Thursday. All year 6 children should arrive between 8.30 and 8.45 to ensure a smooth, calm and prompt start to the testing.

Next term we will also have year 1 phonics testing and the year 4 children will be sitting their multiplication tests.

Your child should have come home with a clubs letter this week. We will be starting clubs this coming Monday. All after school clubs finish at 4.30 as it is the Summer Term and the evenings are now lighter. Please look in the window of Oakwood class for the new club list.

We are aiming for swimming to start at as soon as the weather warms up. We are looking for volunteers to help during our swimming sessions, if you think this is something you may be able to support us with please contact Mrs Sage in the school office and she will arrange for your DBS to be carried out. A timetable will be sent out once the weather has improved and we can actually begin swimming! Please remember to make sure your child's swimming letter is returned.


