Dear Parents and Carers,

It seems very strange to end the week by not being in school on a Friday, especially when we have a Bank Holiday weekend ahead of us! More and more meetings and courses are now taking place in person as opposed to via an online platform, which is great as meetings flow so much better when they are in person but the downside is that both myself and Mrs Place are out of school more than we would have been previously. This week has been a particularly busy week full of meetings!

Thank you to all the parents and children who supported us with the after school Book Fair over the last week. We raised almost £500 for us to purchase books for the school. Each teacher has chosen a selection of books for their children to read in class and also to take home to read. You will see some of the new books selected for the children in Fir Tree and Forge class in the reading shed next week.

A letter was sent home yesterday regarding May Day, which will take place on Saturday 18th May 11.00 - 2.00. All children will be expected to be in school on that day. If you have any questions regarding May Day please contact the office or speak to either me or Mrs Place on the school gate. Thank you for your generous donations towards the variety of stalls, there will be lots of prizes to be won! It has been lovely this week to watch the children from across the school start to practise the May Day dances, although it doesn't feel warm enough to be May! We are still looking for some volunteers to man some of the stalls. We do not yet have anyone for the Smash the Crockery Stall or the Coconut Shy. We are also short of volunteers to man the BBQ. If you do feel that you could run one of these stalls or help someone else with running a stall please do let me know. Without enough volunteers we will be unable to have these stalls running. All the staff have got together and have a variety of games (similar to Pumpkin morning) for the children (and adults) to have a go at. These stalls will be priced between 20p and 50p, so please make sure you have some change to spend, we will find it tricky if we have to give lots of change!

We are still waiting for the weather to warm up before we start swimming, although we have had some glimpses of the sun this week, we still need it to be much warmer before the children are able to swim. We are following guidance regarding the minimum air temperatures for children to be able to swim in an outdoor pool. We are still hopeful swimming may begin before the half term but with the current forecast this is looking less likely - we will keep you updated.

We have been looking at our music provision in school and whilst the children have enjoyed Rocksteady we will be stopping with this in July in order to offer different musical opportunities for the children. From September we will have different after school musical provision for the children to be able to learn an instrument. Thank you so much to Evie's dad, in Fir Tree class, for purchasing several new recorders for us after seeing the alert we sent out. The year 4 children will be learning how to play the recorder as part of their music curriculum.

Well done Oakwood for leading the school in worship on Tuesday. It was about the theme of Mercy and Justice, with a focus on Mercy Ships. Mercy Ships is a global Christian charity that follows the 2,000-year-old model of Jesus to bring hope and healing to those suffering from disability, disfigurement, and disease. They deploy hospital ships and partner with African nations to transform surgical systems and provide free surgery to those most in need. The children found this fascinating and were very interested to know more about this charity. We will be following this up with the school council who are keen to find a way to support this charity.
