Dear Parents and Carers,

The school is beginning to become a hub of excitement as we get ever closer to the big day and the end of term. The children are looking forward to all the upcoming events planned for the final week of term.

Our infant children performed their nativity 'Wriggly Nativity' on Tuesday and Wednesday this week - and what a treat it was. They remembered all the words to the different songs they had learned; there were lots of songs for them to remember. The narrators spoke very clearly and confidently. The shepherds, sheep, stable animals, stars, kings, princesses and camels, townspeople, angels, Mary and Joseph and the donkey all remembered where they had to go and what they needed to do when they were on the stage. The children spoke clearly and all seemed to really enjoy the opportunity. I was particularly impressed with Violet Dunn, what a very majestic Angel Gabriel she made, Elijah Snowden who spoke so clearly, Noah Charnock for his confidence in singing a small solo and Milo Carr who sang every song with such enthusiasm and enjoyment. Thank you to all the parents and grandparents who came to watch - it was a lovely performance, and the children performed with such confidence and enthusiasm. They all did a super job!

Our year 6 children visited St. Matthew's on Tuesday for the Experience Christmas Event - their behaviour was impeccable as ever and their responses were both insightful and thoughtful. Thank you to Rev. Brain who organised this for our children - the biscuits and squash also went down very well and were much appreciated by the children!

The junior performance of 'Time for a Change' will take place on Monday at 2.15pm. We will not be opening the doors until 2.00pm as we will be getting the hall ready after lunchtime and need the time to be able to set up. The evening performance will start at 6.00pm. We need all children dropped off between 5.30pm and 5.45pm so we can get them into their costumes and ready for the performance. The infant children will watch the dress rehearsal on Monday morning, so will be given the opportunity to watch older siblings then. We are hoping after a weekend of rest they will all be well enough to return and enjoy the opportunity to perform to parents and grandparents. Please remember we have asked that only 2 people watch each performance per family due to a lack of space and no pre school siblings please. Tea and coffee will be available before both performances.

The children are becoming increasingly tired as the weeks go on, particularly our younger children. You may find they are becoming more irritable and tearful at home - this is normal! They have now been at school for a long time and really need a break. The school days are very busy and they are also very excited - most children do not fair well with the build up to events. If you are having the odd melt down at home - you are probably not alone! Make sure your child has lots of reassuring cuddles and an early night or two!

For the end of term party we are asking that children wear their own clothes - they will be going on the Bethlehem walk in the morning, where the children walk around the village looking for the painted signs from scenes of Bethlehem, (they will need something warm to wear), followed by time in the church singing carols together as a school. The parties will take place in the afternoon. Please send your child into school with a small plate of party type food, do not send them in with lots of food as they will have eaten lunch already and it is only intended for them to eat; not for them to share with their friends. Please cover the plate with foil or clingfilm and label with your child's name. These plates of food will need to come into school with your child and will be kept in the classrooms until after lunchtime. A disposable plate would be preferred as we will not be able to ensure everyone returns home with the correct plate at the end of what will already be a very hectic afternoon! Please can I remind you not to send your child in with any products containing nuts as we do have children with nut allergies in school.

Click on the link in the scrolling bar on the home page, this will take you to the Advent Calendar where you can click on a window each day and follow the clues to win a Christmassy treat! This can also be found on the school Jotter App. The children have all been given an answer sheet to fill out and return to the office on Friday 15th December to receive their treat. Don't forget to send in your photos of your child reading with their elf.

Our **Elf on a Bookshelf** has gone for a wander, if you have had an extra elf appear in your home please return him back to school so he can return to his bookshelf!
